





#### **DFW CLIMATE**

The climate of Dallas/Fort Worth is humid subtropical with hot summers. It is also continental, characterized by a wide annual temperature range. Precipitation varies considerably, annual values ranging from less than 20 inches to more than 50 inches. The precipitation is also unevenly distributed throughout the year, typically favoring a bimodal distribution of wet spring/fall and dry summer/winter.

Winters are generally mild, but the season features considerable temperature variability. Periodic cold fronts bring usually brief spells of below normal temperatures. A warming trend usually follows a bout of cold weather, typically culminating before the next cold front arrives. Although winter is the cloudiest season, less precipitation occurs than during the adjacent seasons of fall and spring. Brief precipitation often accompanies frontal passages, but more prolonged periods of rain and drizzle can occur when cold air is in place.

During the peak summer months of July and August, also the sunniest months of the year, daytime temperatures are consistently in the 90s, often reaching or exceeding 100 degrees. Gulf moisture maintains stifling humidity, and overnight temperatures can stay above 80 degrees.

The transition seasons of spring and fall are typically the wettest periods of the year, but the bulk of the rainfall is associated with thunderstorms, and extended periods of pleasant weather still occur.

#### DOWNTOWN DALLAS

The M Streets (also known as Greenland Hills) and Vickery Place have established conservation districts to preserve the tidy Tudors and Craftsman cottages that give the area its signature historic charm.

# **OAK CLIFF**

Oak Cliff is one of Dallas' hidden jewel neighborhoods that sits just across the Trinity River from downtown. The hip neighborhood is known for its indie stores, charming Bishop Arts District, exceptional dining and the Oak Cliff Nature Preserve, which offers hiking and biking trails.

#### PRESTON HOLLOW

Known as the golden corridor of Dallas, Preston Hollow is an affluent neighborhood home to many of Dallas' wealthiest residents. The neighborhood's abundant high-end shops and trendy restaurants make Preston Hollow an attractive home.

# UNIVERSITY PARK

The affluent University Park is anchored by the prestigious Southern Methodist University and home to many well-to-do Dallasites and their families. Residents are fond of the neighborhood's upscale dining and trendy local boutiques as well as its top-notch public schools.

#### **UPTOWN**

Just north of downtown, the Uptown-State Thomas neighborhood is one of Dallas' most dynamic live-work-play communities. #### MIDWAY HOLLOW

# **RICHARDSON**

Located in north Tarrant County along State Highway 114, Westlake is a desirable place to call home. Settled in 1847 by several families and once a 2,000-acre ranch known as Circle T Ranch in the mid-twentieth century, Westlake has been developed into several upscale communities.

# COLLEYVILLE

A short commute to nearby DFW International Airport and the Las Colinas business district, Colleyville is an attractive city for many area residents. Once a country town along the Cotton Belt Route, Colleyville is now known for its affluence, continued growth and being a safe place to call home.

#### **KELLER**

Settled in the 1850s due to its proximity to the Trinity River water supply and plentiful farmland, the city of Keller is a convenient suburb of the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. Great big-city amenities and attractions mix with the small-town feel to offer Keller residents a great quality of life.

# **GRAPEVINE**

Grapevine always has something going on in its historic downtown and the vibrant city is known as a top destination for wine lovers. 


